Honorary degrees will be given to U.S. Surgeon General Regina Benjamin; Harlem Children's Zone CEO and President Geoffrey Canada and John Ruffin, director of the National Institute on Minority Health and Health Disparities. Other highlights include entertainment by Dr. Michael White's Original Liberty Jazz Band and singer Wanda Rouzan, herald trumpets, confetti cannons, a traditional New Orleans second-line procession and surprise special guests.
