

Campus comes alive with student activity

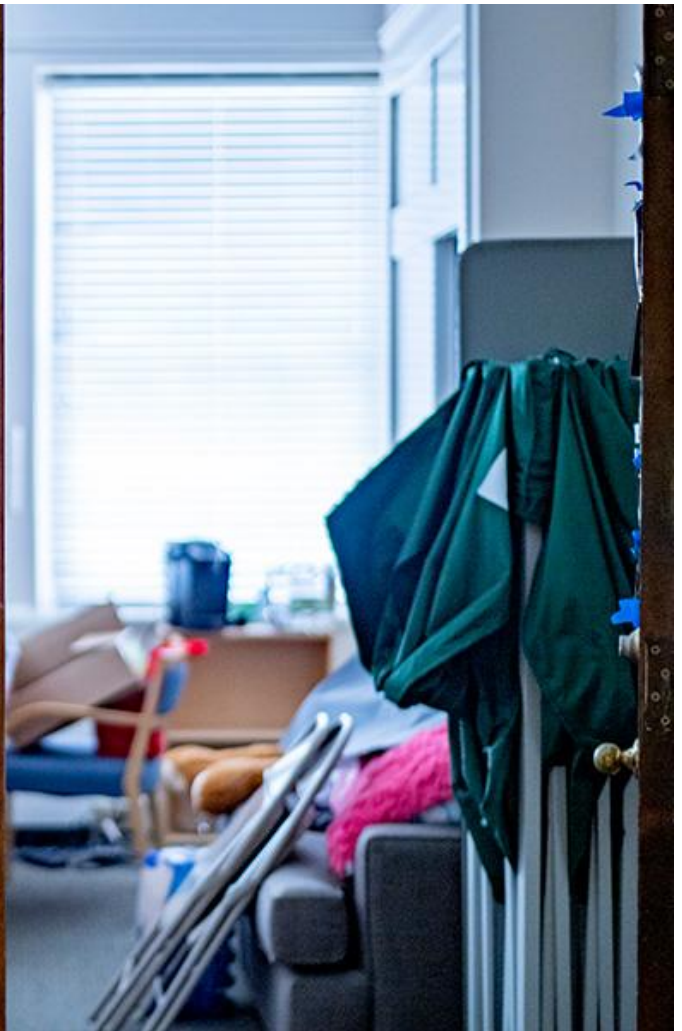
