Hurricane Zeta, which made landfall on Wednesday as a Category 2 hurricane, passed through the New Orleans area quickly. Now it is time to begin our recovery. There are widespread power outages in New Orleans and throughout Southeast Louisiana with trees and power lines downed throughout the city.

To conduct cleanup and make vital repairs, the university will be closed on Thursday, and all classes will be canceled. Campuses will be open to essential

personnel only. Information regarding Friday operations will be shared Thursday. The School of Medicine has issued a separate message regarding their operational plans.

Our students are safe in their residence halls, which are on our co-generation power. Thursday, we will open the Commons beginning at 9 a.m. Please check dining.services.tulane.edu for additional locations that may be available. Full dining operations will resume on Friday.
