serves as principal violist of the Meridian Symphony Orchestra. Bunchman, who is also an active soloist, serves as director of USM's Collaborative Piano Program and is the director of music and collaborative piano at the International Performing Arts Institute in Bavaria, Germany.

For the fall 2021 semester, Music at Midday is held at the Myra Clare Rogers Memorial Chapel from noon to 1 p.m. weekly through Dec. 8.

The next concert, which will be held on Wednesday, Oct. 20, will feature The Lott Quartet, which consists of Kurt Münstedt and Benjamin Thacher as violinists, Luke Fleming as violist, and Rachel Hsieh as cellist.
