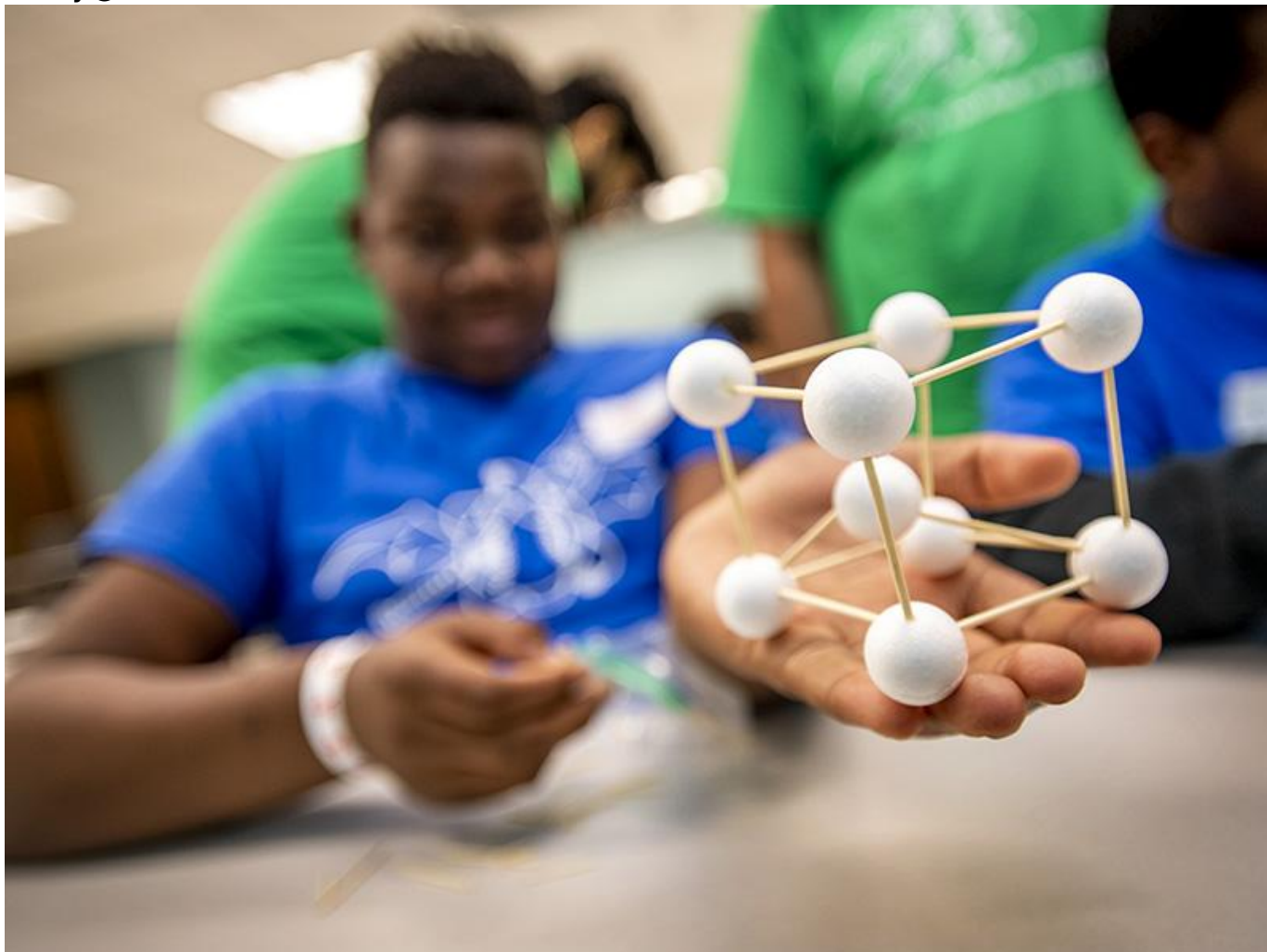


Science Saturday
