In addition to receiving checks for \$1,000, the recipients will be honored later this month at a dinner hosted by the president and his wife, Marjorie, at their home.

Nominees for the Staff Excellence Awards are reviewed by a committee of previous recipients and vetted by the President's Cabinet. The Staff Excellence Award is open to all staff employees who are employed 50 percent or more with benefits and have successfully completed their six-month evaluation period. The program excludes vice presidents and university officers from participating.
