The Green Wave will step up to the plate against Boston College in a three-game home series on the uptown campus, today (Feb. 19 at 6:30 p.m.), Saturday (Feb. 20 at 1 p.m.), and Sunday (Feb. 21 at 1 p.m.).

Graffagnini describes baseball as his first love. His passion for the game, Green Wave players and their loyal fans radiates from his actions before he even enters the press box.

The announcer keeps a ritual of arriving at the stadium two hours before every game to fully prepare, and, for superstitious reasons, you can catch him in the outfield while the players warm up during batting practice. Having called approximately 1,000 baseball games, Graffagnini is known as the Voice of the Green Wave and describes his position as "feeling like you're a part of the team even though you're not playing." He knows the team inside and out ? "the stats get ingrained in your head after staying very close with coaches and being around the players every day."

Graffagnini appreciates Tulane fans, whose support plays a "huge part" in the team's success. He grew up in New Orleans, and says the same support that brought 3,000 fans to the Tulane ballpark during his childhood is still very much alive at Turchin Stadium.

"It's a great place to watch the game," says Graffagnini.
