"We always wanted to have a French film festival in the New Orleans area," says Kathryn LeMieux of Ecole Bilingue de la Nouvelle-Orléans. "This has been a great partnership with Tulane. It is important for New Orleans, with its rich French heritage, to have a strong French cinema presence. We felt this was lacking and wanted to collaborate together to create a festival that will gain in strength, importance and prominence in the years to come."

For the showings on the Tulane campus, the Newcomb College Center for Research on Women received funding from the [Tournees Film Festival](#) through a grant program designed to support the screening of contemporary French cinema on American college campuses. The Tournees Film Festival is a French American Cultural Exchange program, supported by Cultural Services of the French Embassy and the French Ministry of Culture.
