

Nuts and Bolts of Urban Farming

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"Urban Agriculture and Health for an Urbanizing World: Delusion or Inspiration?" is the topic of an interdisciplinary panel discussion today in room 204 of Jones Hall on the uptown campus.

The session, scheduled from 12:30 until 2 p.m., features four experts talking about the topic, with Ann Yoachim as moderator. Yoachim is program manager for the Institute on Water Resources and Law Policy and an adjunct instructor in the Department of Environmental Health Sciences at the School of Public Health and Tropical Medicine.
