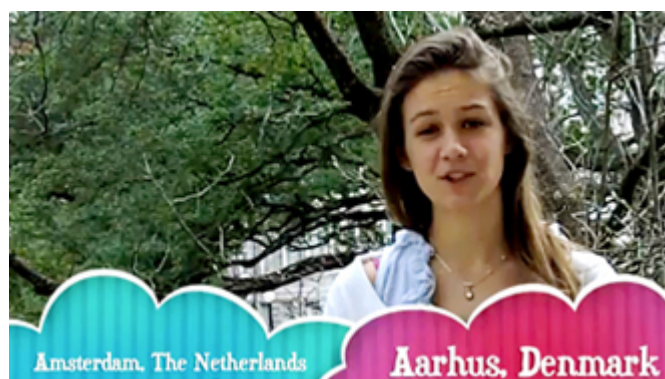


[Student Videos Highlight Engaged Learning](#)

A series of videos highlighting the student experience with the Tulane Center for Engaged Learning and Teaching has hit cyberspace.
