
Final Four makeover

While New Orleans prepares to welcome thousands of visitors for the NCAA Final Four men's basketball championship, the Mercedes-Benz Superdome has its own interior preparations under way to add a new seating configuration, a new scoreboard and the playing surface.

The games take place in the Superdome on March 31 and April 2, but related events are taking place across the city. Because Tulane is the host institution for the <u>Final</u> Four, many Tulane staff members are involved in the planning and production.
