If you want to know more about what goes on behind the scenes in the Israeli military's battle to ensure the country's security and prevent Palestinian terrorism, attend next Monday's (April 23) lecture by Col. Bentzi Gruber of the Israel Defense

Forces. He will speak on "Ethics in the Field: What Sets Israel Apart." The discussion will be at 7 p.m. in the Richardson Building, room 117, on the uptown campus.

Hen Caspi, a native Israeli who serves as Israel programs director at <u>Hillel</u>, says the festival gives the university community an in-depth look at a country that applauds the spread of democratic values, just as the United States does.

"Israel and the United States have shared a mutually beneficial relationship for years now, and we hope to celebrate a country that strives to fulfill basic human rights," says Caspi.
