Holocaust survivor to speak Thursday

Eva Kor, a Holocaust survivor and a twin experimented on at age 10 by Josef Mengele, will speak on "Ethics in Medicine and Research: Lessons from Dr. Mengele's Lab" on Thursday (Sept. 6) in a lecture hosted by Tulane University School of Medicine.



The survivor of Nazi medical experiments will tell her remarkable story at the Louisiana Memorial Pavilion of the National World War II Museum in downtown New Orleans.
