

James Carville, Mary Matalin to co-host post-election political summit

The Bipartisan Policy Center (BPC) will host its Fourth Annual Political Summit, "Beyond the Ballot: A Government in Transition," at Tulane University in New Orleans on Thursday, Nov. 15. Co-hosted by popular bipartisan political duo James Carville and Mary Matalin, the much-anticipated summit will feature more than two dozen current and former elected officials, national political strategists from both sides of the aisle and prominent journalists.

Panel discussions throughout the [day-long event](#) will explore the current political landscape and examine where the two parties may find common ground going forward to address the nation's key policy issues.
