Every grain of sand

A compass is employed to take a precise measurement. The sand mandala is part of the Tibetan Buddhist tradition and has been called a "roadmap to enlightenment," as every color, dot and line represents a part of Buddhist philosophy. Each component must be placed in exactly the same place every time the mandala is constructed.
