Roger Dunaway, assistant athletics director for athletics communications at Tulane University, says there are other notable facts that Green Wave fans should know about the old Tulane Stadium.

"Tulane Stadium was the host site for three of the first nine Super Bowls in 1970, 1972 and 1975," Dunaway adds. "The 1975 Super Bowl was supposed to be played at the new Louisiana Superdome, but the facility was not completed in time to host the game. #x201d;
