THINGS ARE CHANGING



YULMAN STADIUM

Football returns to the Tulane uptown campus in the fall of 2014 after almost four decades in the Superdome.

ZIMPLE HOUSE

The idea of having a building that flanks Newcomb Hall across Newcomb lawn from Josephine Louise Hall dates back to 1912 and the original plan for the Newcomb campus. Zimple House will be a new residential college for 256 students starting in the fall semester 2014.



HOWARD-TILTON MEMORIAL LIBRARY

Two additional floors are being added to Howard-Tilton Memorial Library. This addition will house elements of the library that were formerly located in the basement, as well as elements from the damaged lower stack level of Jones Hall. These areas were flooded after Hurricane Katrina in 2005.



NEW RESEARCH LABS

In 2013 Tulane completed a \$13.5 million renovation of the laboratory spaces in the J. Bennett Johnston Health and Environmental Research Building, setting the stage for a vibrant hub of interdisciplinary research. The goal is to enhance medical research output by involving investigators in the physical sciences, engineering and public health for years to come.

NEW HOME FOR TULANE CANCER CENTER

The Tulane Cancer Center relocated cancer investigators, their laboratory teams and its administrative unit into the new Louisiana Cancer Research Center, a

10-story, \$102 million facility near the Tulane downtown campus. In all, approximately 100 cancer center personnel will work in the new, state-funded building.



TEACHING KITCHEN

The Goldring Center for Culinary Medicine—a first-of-its-kind teaching kitchen affiliated with a medical school—will move into its new location in this 4,600-square-foot facility being built in the Refresh Project, a redevelopment of the former Schwegmann Bros. grocery store on Broad and Bienville streets that will include a Whole Foods Market.



A WINNING SEASON

The Green Wave football team capped off a turn-around season with an invitation to play in the New Orleans Bowl on Dec. 21. Head coach Curtis Johnson is injecting a new spirit of excitement into the Tulane football program.
