Lybrand: We have nothing to gain. I"m going to tell you the truth, if I like the CoverGirl product over the Dior. Someone who works at Dior is only going to push for Dior. People who are beauty gurus also have the time to show you how to apply

it properly.

New Wave: What sets you apart from the other beauty gurus?

Lybrand: I"m not afraid to be gross. If I have a really bad breakout, I get excited about it, turn on the camera and then cover it. I show all the imperfections.

New Wave: What beauty trends are you excited to see in 2015?

Lybrand: The "90s are coming back ? the heavy eyeliner, dark lips and bold brows. We"re getting away from tiny eyebrows and going for more of a Brooke Shields look. For the past two years, it"s been all about the berry lip, and we"re getting away from that and going dark. I like the new extreme of things.

New Wave: Why did you decide to go back to Tulane for a public relations degree, after receiving your bachelor's degree in theater in 2008?
