"I'm very proud of the students. I see them every day, and their conduct and energy is really great," Tom Benson beams. "I can"t wait for opening day. It"s such a great thing for this whole community, and I"m just looking forward to Tulane to keep growing."

The Bensons have always adored Tulane University. In fact, Tom Benson's great uncle, Herbert Benson, served as the architect of record for the old Tulane Stadium. In addition to their strong ties to the Green Wave, Gayle Benson was elected to the Board of Tulane recently.

"It"s with a great sense of humility that we"ve been able to do this for Tulane," she says. "We"ll be helping the whole student body, the athletes, the fans. It"s going to bring a new awareness to the university. It needed this."

When asked how they will feel when the football team runs onto Benson Field for the first time, Tom Benson immediately cheers, "I can hardly wait!"
