Senior <u>Jamie Kaplan</u> has quite a list of accomplishments during her Tulane University career, but there is one national honor that could still come her way, if Green Wave fans will join in online voting between now and March 23. The senior captain of the women"s basketball team, Kaplan is one of 10 national finalists for the prestigious Senior CLASS Award.

The first Tulane women"s student-athlete to be chosen for the award, she was named a finalist on Feb. 12. The award honors those NCAA Division-I student athletes who have made notable achievements in community, classroom, character and competition. CLASS, an acronym for Celebrating Loyalty and Achievement for Staying in School, focuses on the total student-athlete and encourages students to use their athletic platforms to make a positive impact as leaders in their communities.

"To be recognized for achievements not only on the court, but off the court, is very rewarding," Kaplan said. "I am really excited that I have been able to make a positive impact in my community as a student athlete."

A neuroscience major with a 3.832 GPA, Kaplan plans to attend medical school after graduation. She has volunteered at several hospitals throughout the area to extend her education, but also has been active in community programs, from tutoring at a New Orleans school to rebuilding and renovation projects.
