About two years ago, Wilkin says she realized that she was skilled at nail art when her friends began asking her to paint their nails. She began posting to Instagram under the name <u>alldemnails</u>, which led to her gaining nearly 12,000 followers. She also plans to start a YouTube page where she can post tutorials for her designs.
