Marine vets at law school get national spotlight

Before they even got into the meat of their first semester, <u>Tulane Law School</u> students Andrew Darlington and Jackson Smith were attracting national attention.

In July, Darlington was featured in a National Public Radio story about the

rejuvenation of New Orleans" Veterans of Foreign Wars post.

Then, a <u>Washington Post column</u> Smith wrote about his friend Brian McKenna led to two appearances on <u>"The Ellen DeGeneres Show."</u>

It"s a lot to juggle. But both are used to demanding duty: Darlington and Smith are U.S. Marine Corps veterans, and each deployed twice to Afghanistan.

Darlington helped his Afghan translator secure a job and housing to relocate in Houston.

Meanwhile, Smith is raising funds for McKenna, who has been undergoing rehab after being paralyzed in a bike accident.

In his *Post* column, Smith wrote that while he was in Afghanistan in 2010, McKenna took a life-size cardboard cutout of him in Marine uniform to Carnival events, where he snapped a picture with Saints quarterback Drew Brees.

This summer, Smith returned the favor, getting a shot of Brees with McKenna"s cutout at a Saints practice at Yulman Stadium on the Tulane uptown campus.

When Smith and McKenna appeared on DeGeneres" show Sept. 30, she surprised them with a Skype visit from Brees, who presented McKenna with a \$40,000 check to buy a specialized wheelchair.

"I"m so fortunate to be at the intersection of so many incredible things happening and incredible people being involved," Smith said.

B.</u> <u>Freeman School of Business</u>, on Sunday (Nov. 8) at The Boot, 1039 Broadway St. VIP tickets (\$100) include brunch from 10-11:30 a.m. The party from 11:30 a.m.-7 p.m. is open to the public with a \$20 cover and bottomless bloody marys and mimosas. The event includes a silent auction.
