The Top Performers program recognizes hospitals that attain excellence on accountability measures related to evidence-based care for certain conditions, including heart attack, heart failure, pneumonia, surgical care, children"s asthma, inpatient psychiatric services, stroke, venous thromboembolism, immunization and perinatal care.

<u>Tulane Health System</u> facilities in the New Orleans area include Tulane Medical Center, Tulane Lakeside Hospital for Women and Children, Tulane Pediatrics, Tulane Cancer Center Comprehensive Clinic, Tulane Transplant Institute, Tulane Multispecialty Center Metairie, Tulane Multispecialty Center Uptown, Tulane Multispecialty Center Downtown and the Tulane Institute of Sports Medicine.

Tulane Medical Center recently unveiled a new 26-bed Surgical Care Unit, and added more than 50 medical and surgical beds throughout the facility. Tulane Lakeside Hospital for Women and Children received national recognition as a Baby-friendly Birth Facility.

Both facilities show substantial improvements in patient satisfaction since the implementation of leader rounding at the beginning of this year.
