Described as Bill Gates" favorite teacher, Khan is on a mission to provide a free, world-class education for anyone, anywhere. He started Khan Academy to offer free online educational materials, including instructional videos, assessment exercises, dashboard analytics and teacher tools, that support personalized, mastery-based, interactive education for users of all ages. The Academy, which grew out of a series of online YouTube videos Khan created to tutor nieces and nephews in New Orleans, now has more than 6 million users per month. It has delivered more than 250 million lessons in the last two years, covering subjects from basic math to college-level biology and art history.

Khan has been profiled by Fast Company, Forbes, "60 Minutes" and named one of TIME magazine"s 100 most influential people in the world. After his presentation, Khan will answer questions from the audience and sign copies of his new book, The One World Schoolhouse: Education Reimagined.
