After two rounds of judging, three teams of Tulane University students have progressed to the final stage of the 2010 NewDay Challenge, a competition in which Tulane students present their social entrepreneurial ventures to a panel of judges for a chance to win \$20,000 in seed money. The NewDay Challenge proposals must describe financially sustainable business models that have a primary goal of effecting positive social change in New Orleans. The finalists for the 2010 award are:

The CAEP activates when a mandatory evacuation is called in the city of New Orleans and has the ability to move 25,000-30,000 New Orleanians without transportation.

ââ?¬Â¢ Drop The Chalk (Jonathan Rovick, Stephen Corburn, Kurt Gerwitz and Jen Schnidman), a student achievement database that guides in analyzing and acting upon student data, such as grades, attendance and behavioral patterns.

ââ?¬Â¢ Nanofex (Justin Levy, Xavier Cabo, Julio Moscoso and Ashton Prat), a forprofit venture that provides an affordable, effective method for remediating Tri-Chloro Ethylene and other chlorinated volatile organic compounds, which are common, but extremely dangerous waste products.
