Goldberg, who is majoring in International Relations in the School of Liberal Arts Department of Political Science, is quite pleased with the chance to apply her studies to real-world situations.

“I’m considering the U.S. Foreign Service as one of my future career options,” said Goldberg. “I thought this would be an incredible opportunity to experience that work

firsthand.”

At the embassy, Goldberg’s role is to work on public diplomacy outreach, cultural and educational programming, and engaging Peruvian and American people with one another.
